walk away. And it would make me walk away as well. That's the job of the editors. You should know that stories in the media essentially always go through editorial process – for good and valid reasons – except when the editorial process is influenced by the folks in charge.

Editorial content can be subtly applied, and anyone in the big-time media knows that the stories will be changed outside of their control before final printing or posting. They may have to "walk it back" if it goes too far. Their stories won't be retweeted as much, of counter-memes will be released to obviate the message, or the story will run its course and be lost in the sea of other stories while the author loses access and influence over time. That's the job of the editor, and the editor is hired by the owner, so guess who wins hearts and minds in the end.

# Come the Trump card

Every once in a while the truth is revealed. Donald Trump is an example. I won't express a political view here. I merely note that he seems to say whatever he wants to say and he has a lot of fans. A lot of what he says is probably true as far as he knows, if only because his ego limits his willingness and ability to lie, and perhaps because he is actually sincere. There is no single "best" answer and even if there was such a thing, being rich, powerful, influential, famous, or (self-)important doesn't mean you know what's right, or true, or anything else.

### Power corrupts, money is power → money corrupts

Don't you just love it when capitalism is attacked! If you believe in money as a religion, any attack on the notion that wealth associates with holiness (or at least holier than thou-ness) is sinful and must be suppressed and destroyed. Money does not equate to smart or skilled. Rich can come from luck, circumstance, hard work, intellect, lineage, or any number of other things, and because of the sequential nature of getting rich or poor, one early win can make an Elon Musk or break a ..... we don't know her name because she never made it. Not everyone can be at the right place at the right time. But luck does seem to favor the prepared.

## The most important thing to understand about propaganda, power, and influence

To counter propaganda the first best rule to remember and hold close is that no human being is really all that smart. They may be or seem smarter than you, depending on how you measure it, but even if they seem to really know a lot, neither they, you, nor I know all that much about all that much. The best experts in the world who have spent a lifetime learning and studying and understanding specific subjects are usually the people who know more about what they don't know than anyone else. The folks who know less than the top experts often think they know more, but when encountering the top expert, they often find out a few things they don't know, and this is the path to their education.

# Summary:

People are not very smart, even if they are smarter than any other creature we are aware of. If you were really smart, you would likely not reveal it to the rest of us, knowing you would be destroyed by us out of fear or hatred or whatever. When you believe in the charismatic leader, you are supporting a fundamental untruth about the world – that they know a whole lot more than you do. You can bet they don't. Rule 1 in countering propaganda:

Seek truth, test it regularly, and be skeptical of those who claim to know it.
